- Don't make cell phone calls or text while in museum exhibitions
 - o It's rude and disruptive to the museum experience for others.
- Don't eat in the museum exhibitions.
 - Museums often have cafeterias where you can eat a snack.
- Your phone should be set on vibrate or a very low sound.
 - We may need to find you if you're late.
- NEVER touch works of art. Even finger prints can damage art.
- Photography is sometimes forbidden. Ask a guard if you are not sure.
 - o DON'T assume it's ok if others do it.
- NEVER use flash photography, Turn off your camera flash.
 - Light can damage the colors of some work
- Whisper or remain silent. Please don't cause distractions.
- Many people see art museums like churches for art--very special places, so be respectful.
- Take your time to SEE the art and think about what the artist was trying to say.
